Any doubt about San Francisco's postwar growing pains was removed yesterday when the Chamber of Commerce made known the results of its January survey of business. The general business index rang the bell for a new high at 223.5, or 7.8 per cent above January a year

Retail department store sales were up 8.9 per cent; freight car move-ments, 5.9 per cent; electrical en-ergy sales, 12.5 per cent; industrial and commercial gas sales, 11.2 per cent; water consumption, 27.3 per

Bank debits went up 15.7 per cent; airport traffic was up 10 per cent in terms of planes and 18.2 per cent in terms of passengers. Manufacturing industries in the Bay Area employed 121,300 wage earners, or 38,000 more than a year

ago. Pay rolls were up 60.1 per cent. In the industrial field, 22 expanions for an aggregate expenditure of \$10.110.000 and 42 new industries with outlays of \$1,956,000, compared with 34 expansions for \$2,831,000, and 44 new industries for \$2,631,000
